What is a Warming Center?

- A Community Warming Center, as defined here in Waldo County, ...
 - An accessible facility that is open to the public
 - Opened during a wintertime extended power outage
 - Support those whose homes are without heat
- Alternately, others may come
 - For a hot meal
 - To learn more about what is going on
 - To socialize and communicate with others

What a Warming Center is not

- Not an <u>overnight</u> Emergency Shelter
- Does not provide medical assistance
- Does not provide mental health assistance
- Does not provide social services or general assistance

The difference between a Warming Center and an Emergency Shelter

 A warming center will be hosted by a municipality and supported by local volunteers

 An emergency shelter will be hosted by the County and supported by the American Red Cross

The difference between a Warming Center and an Emergency Shelter

 A warming center will be open for a few hours a day

 An emergency shelter will open 24 hours a day

The difference between a Warming Center and an Emergency Shelter

 A warming center is a place for the community to gather during the day

 An emergency shelter provides sleeping accommodations for those without an adequate place to sleep

Can they co-exist?

Yes!

 The Warming Center and Emergency Shelter could share a cafeteria, kitchen, and meeting space.

 However, we would not want Warming Center visitors spending time in the Shelter dormitory.

Liability

 The municipality hosting the Center assumes liability and costs

 Volunteers activated by Emergency Management are covered for Worker's Comp and General Liability by the State

Warming Center Activation

- The municipal emergency management director (EMD) determines a need exists
 - Will the power be out for several days?
 - Will the temperatures be very cold?
 - Does it appear that residents will use it?

Warming Center Activation

- The municipal EMD will coordinate with the County EMA program.
- The County EMA will coordinate with CMP, the NWS and the State EMA program.
- The City/Town Manager or Board of Selectmen will authorize

Warming Center Activation

- The following will be contacted -
 - The facility owner of the Warming Center
 - The Center volunteers
 - The Public Safety Dispatch Center
 - Local print, online, radio and TV media
 - Suppliers

- The following management activities will occur-
 - Assign a Center Manager
 - Sign in/out volunteers
 - Determine hours of operation
 - Assign staff positions
 - Determine what services will be provided
 - Develop a work plan and schedule

- The following management activities will occur-
 - Determine what supplies and equipment will be needed
 - Ensure backup power is functioning
 - Maintain contact with the host EMD
 - Track expenditures
 - Document major activities and decisions

- The following operational activities will occur-
 - Prepare/stock bathrooms & showers
 - Prepare snacks, refreshments, meals
 - Prepare eating areas
 - Set up entertainment/recreational activities
 - Post outdoor and indoor signage

- Public Outreach-
 - Very difficult during a power outage to get the word out
 - Outdoor signage
 - Social Media
 - Encourage residents to check in on their neighbors and spread the word
 - Advertise it as a Community Event, like a public supper (only free)

- Feeding
 - Determine drink selection (no alcohol!)
 - Determine snack selection
 - Be aware of food allergies
 - Determine if staff, facility and supplies will allow for meals
 - Keep meals easy to prepare

- Entertainment/Recreation
 - Keep simple
 - Avoid religious and political orientation
 - Board/Card Games
 - Books, coloring books, toys
 - Avoid video games
 - Could show movies, but would want separate room

- Information Sharing
 - Set up several bulletin boards
 - Updates on power outage restoration
 - Weather reports/ storm information
 - Local events
 - Where to get government assistance
 - An Assistance Board residents could post offers for service (snowplowing, free firewood, animal care, etc)

- Information Tracking
 - Sign in/out all volunteers critical for liability coverage and accountability
 - Sign in/out all visitors also critical for liability, for tracking logistics and for getting additional resources
 - Expenditures/receipts/donations

- Demobilization
 - Turn in Sign in/out sheets
 - Turn in bills/receipts
 - Clean up the facility
 - Restock Kitchen/bathroom supplies

Warming Center

- Will provide an important emergency service to your community
- Will turn a disaster into something less harmful to the community
